Кожен варіант тесту в свою чергу містить 25 завдань, на виконання яких відводиться 60 хвилин. За правильно виконане одне завдання нараховується один бал. Результати, отримані під час виконання тесту, підлягають кількісному підрахунку, на основі якого виставляється оцінка. Загалом, можна отримати 25 балів.



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
